

REORGANIZATION MEETING

January 6, 2020

The biennial Reorganization Meeting of the Rose Valley Borough Council was held on January 6, 2020 in the Borough Office, 9 Old Mill Lane, Rose Valley, Pa. Mayor Tim Plummer called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Other Council members present were: Councilpersons Debra DeMasi, Bill Hale, Bob Siwicki, and Vippy Yee; Councilpersons-elect Dave Firm, Stephanie Middleton and Judy Voet; Controller John Neilson; Solicitor G. Guy Smith and Secretary Paula Healy.

A guest attending the meeting was Don Voet.

After the Pledge of Allegiance, Mayor Tim Plummer swore in and administered the Loyalty Oaths to Mr. Firm, Ms. Middleton, and Mrs. Voet. The Certificates of Election were submitted and will be held in the Borough Office.

Mayor Plummer called for nominations for the office of President of Council. Dave Firm nominated Bill Hale for President of Council. Mr. Hale was elected President of Council on a unanimous vote. Mr. Plummer then asked for nominations for Vice President of Council. Mrs. DeMasi nominated Dave Firm for Vice President of Council. Mr. Firm was elected Vice President of Council on a unanimous vote. Mr. Hale then asked for nominations for President Pro-Tem of Council. Ms. Yee nominated Bob Siwicki as President Pro-Tem of Council. Mr. Siwicki was elected President Pro-Tem of Council on a unanimous vote.

Mayor Plummer congratulated Council on the great work they do on behalf of the residents of Rose Valley.

After review and adding an "s" to representative, the Minutes of the December 11, 2019 Council meeting were approved on a motion made, seconded and unanimously passed. The Minutes of the December 16, 2019 Public Meeting on the Proposed Budget and Special Budget Approval Meeting were the reviewed and approved on a motion made, seconded and unanimously passed.
